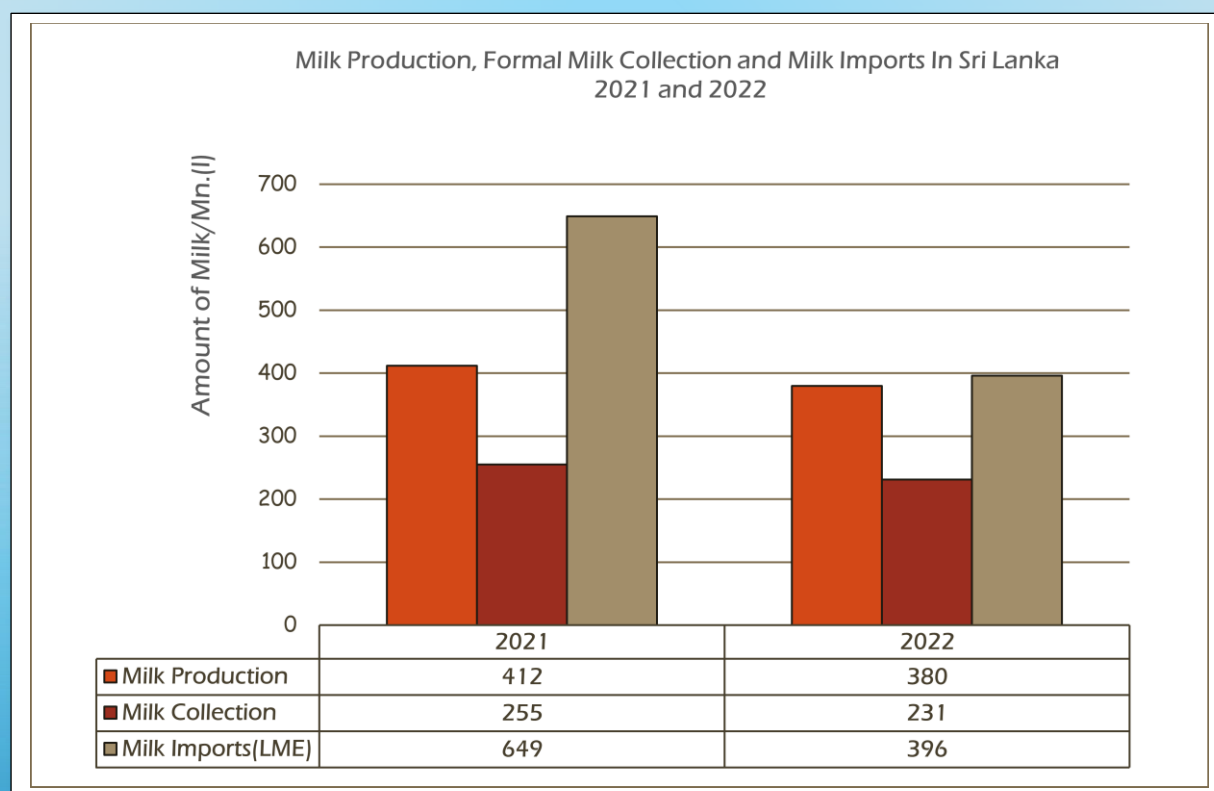
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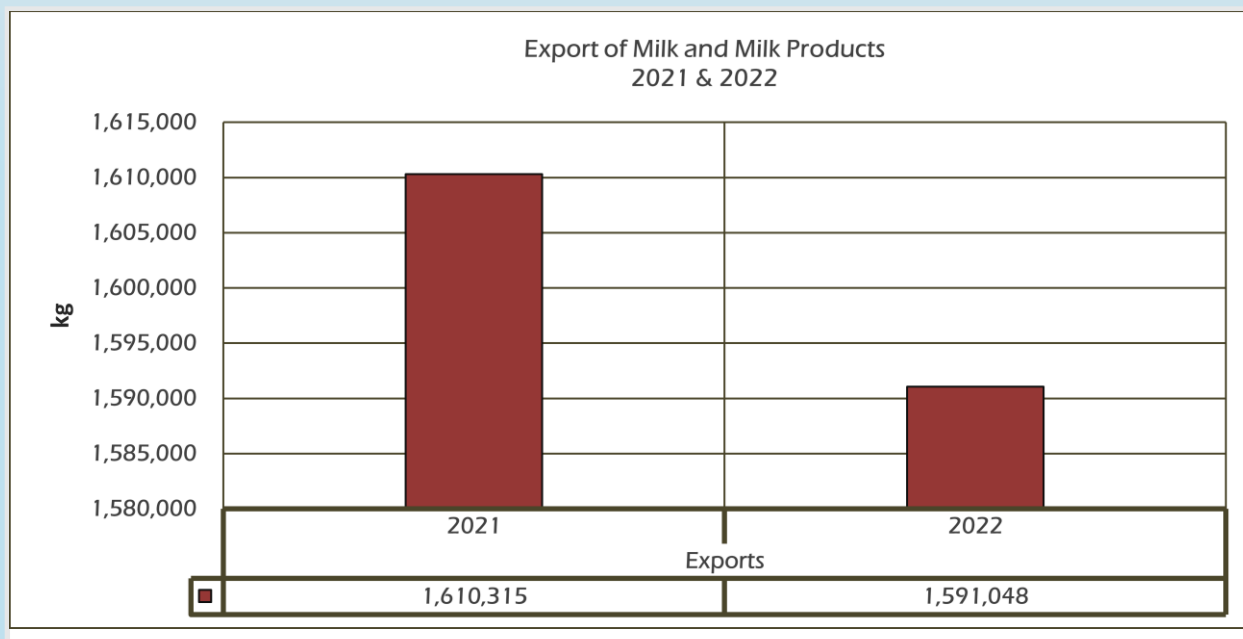

Comparing to year 2021, milk production, collection and imports were decreased by 7% ,9% and 39% respectively in 2022. The main reason behind the decreased production and collection was the interrupted milk collection network resulted due to the economic crisis. In addition considerable portion of the small scale dairy farmers who are the main contributors of national dairy production (80% of the total milk producers) were given up the dairy sector temporarily during the crisis period as their major income source is not the dairy sector. The reduction in milk imports was due to the foreign currency deficit within the country during that period.

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
