- 1. Provincial DAPH Goat Breeding Farm or Registered Private Goat Breeder Farm.
- 2. Need a preference to establish a goat breeder farm.
- 3. Ensure to continue goat breeder farm for at least 5 years.
- 4. Agree to circulate Boer off springs for Provincial DAPH recommended goat breeder farms.
- 5. At least 07 numbers of breedable female goats must use for one stud.
- 6. Require enough land area for goat farming.
- 7. Ensure proper goat sheds with approved conditions.
- 8. Need adequate pasture/fodder cultivation for the herd.
- 9. Ensure quality water supply.
- 10. Make sure proper waste disposal system according to the environmental safety conditions.
- 11. Require adequate labor for goat farming.
- 12. Ensure to maintain the replacement stock at the goat farm.
- 13. Require enough financial capacity for goat farming.
- 14. Work under the guidance of Provincial DAPH staff is must.
