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Veterinary Health Requirements for Importation of Breeding Pigs

The following requirements should be fulfilled

Treatments	<p>Ectoparasites – treated twice with an approved ectoparasiticide with at least 14 days interval and should be completely free of all ectoparasites at embarkation.</p> <p>Endoparasites - treated twice with an approved endo-parasiticide with 10-14 days interval. 1 st treatment prior to entering pre-export quarantine and 2 nd treatment to be done 3 days prior to embarkation.</p>	Certification by the Government Veterinary Authority
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1. Animals should have been identified by a permanent mark and should be enabling it to be traced back to the dam and piggery of origin.
2. Animals should be examined on the day of embarkation and should be in a good state of health with no deformities and no clinical sign of any disease and fit for transport.
3. The animals should have been isolated in an establishment identified for pre-export quarantine for Thirty (30) days immediately prior to export.
4. The transport of the animals by air must be in accordance with the live animal's regulations of the International Air Transport Association.
5. Animals should have been kept since birth in the country of origin.
6. Animals should have not been in contact with any animal showing any clinical signs of any infectious, contagious diseases including the diseases mentioned in section 2. for a period of three (03) months immediately prior to embarkation.
8. The certificate of the country of origin should be certified by the relevant authority

Health protocol may vary from time to time according to the disease status reported to WOAHA and the health status of the exporting country
