Veterinary Health Requirements for Importation of shrimp brood stock into Sri Lanka

The following requirements should be fulfilled

Quarantine Requirement

- The consignment will be subjected to Quarantine surveillance at an identified isolated place on its arrival and test the F₀ population for above mention diseases in accordance with OIE guidelines to determine the suitability as brood stock. Produced F₁ generation will be subjected to quarantine and test for above diseases. If the above diseases are not detected in the F₁ population, it may be released from quarantine. If the above diseases are detected in the F₁ population, it will be destroyed and disposed in a bio secure manner.

Other Requirements

- The intended date of arrival of the consignment should be notified to the Animal Quarantine Officer, Katunayake at least four (04) days prior to arrival.
- Importer should agree to
 - Submit laboratory samples of shrimp and water at the time of Quarantine clearance for further investigation, at the port of entry and during the quarantine surveillance period
 - Inform immediately to the Animal Quarantine Officers if you notice any abnormal behavior / shrimp mortality during the quarantine surveillance period.
 - Bear all the expenses incurred for testing during this period

Health protocol may vary from time to time according to the disease status reported to OIE and the health status of the exporting country
