Quarantine Requirement

- This consignment should be subjected to quarantine inspection at the time of import and originals of the all above mentioned documents should be forwarded for inspection.
- The consignment will be subjected to Quarantine surveillance at an identified isolated place for minimum period of 14 (Fourteen) days on its arrival.

Other Requirements

- The intended date of arrival of the consignment should be notified to the Animal Quarantine Officer, Katunayake at least four (04) days prior to arrival.
- Importer should agree to
 - Submit laboratory samples of fish and water at the time of Quarantine clearance for further investigation, at the port of entry and during the quarantine surveillance period
 - Inform immediately to the Animal Quarantine Officers if you notice any fish mortality during the quarantine surveillance period.
 - Bear all the expenses incurred for testing during this period

Health protocol may vary from time to time according to the disease status reported to OIE and the health status of the exporting country
